
Perform at an Arena THIS WEEK

and 3, phase 4 is embedding this knowledge to become fluent readers.

The children have come home with flash cards and tricky words to practice adding to their pack from Christmas. It is so important that they practice these cards as often as possible and revisit homework sheets.

frequently and listen to their child read AT LEAST 3 times a week. Please fill in your child's reading diary to say you have read together. If you read any more books from home, please fill them in your diary too. Books read at home will receive a REDTED (read everyday, talk everyday) stamp. The more stamps you get, the more prizes you will receive.


We are very excited to soon be launching our new parent communication app. This app will be used by staff in school to give you an insight into the school day by posting photos, sharing updates and reminding you about
