Enquiry/ Fieldwork

Investigate how cities in Europe are becoming more sustainable. E.g. Bristol (green space), Copenhagen (cycling), Oslo (Hydro power).

- Use the eight points of the compass.
- Identify the equator, longitude and latitude.
- Identify and locate the tropics, vegetation belts, Arctic circle and Antarctic circle.

- Name and locate the countries of Europe.
- Name and locate 5 large capital cities in Europe: Berlin, Moscow, Paris, London and Madrid.
- Name and locate forests in Europe and investigate which countries have the most forest areas. (Russia)
- Name the natural resources found in Europe.
- Explore how trade works in Europe.

Key Vocabulary

Trade	Buying and selling goods
Natural resources	Materials that are found in nature that can be exploited.
Exploited	Benefit from from Old French exploit (noun), based on Latin explicare 'unfold' The early notion of 'success, progress' gave rise to the sense 'attempt to capture', 'military expedition', hence the current sense of the
