Retrieval and Review

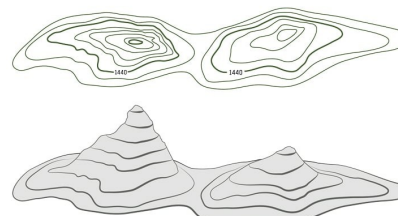
- Name and locate and identify the four countries of the UK and its surrounding seas.

- Name and locate cities in the UK. Coastal and non coastal: Birmingham, Liverpool, Glasgow, Plymouth, Swansea, Aberdeen, Armagh.
- Identify the different types of settlements.
- Use a topography map to investigate features in the UK.
- Name and locate 5 largest mountains in the UK, Ben Nevis, Snowden, Scafell Pike, Ben Macdui and Helvellyn.
- Investigate how places have changed over time.
- Use the eight points of the compass to describe a location, e.g. Ben Nevis.

Key Vocabulary

Topography	The shape of the land, e.g. flat, hilly.
Region	An area with fixed boundaries.
Map	A picture representation of land or sea.
Settlement	A place where people make a community.
Costal	Areas next to the ocean or sea.
