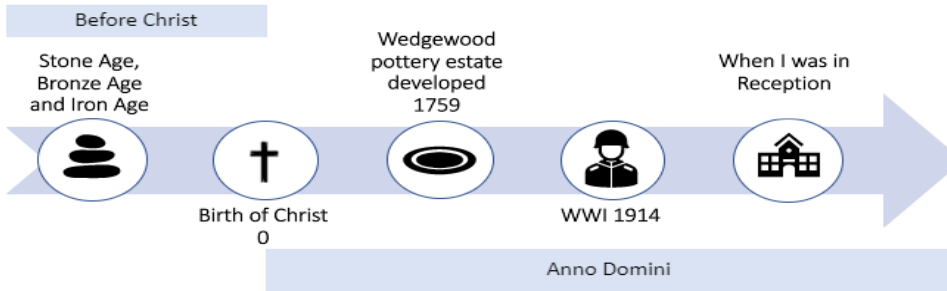
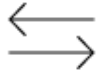

Alloy	A metal made from 2 or more metals
