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Listen & Appraise


Maurice Ravel (1875 - 1937) was a French composer.

Ravel liked children and animals and his music is often about them. He liked to write about fairy tales and stories from far away lands.

He wrote some lovely piano music, most of which is difficult to play.

Boléro is <u>a 17 minute piece</u> for orchestra written in 1928 as a ballet.

A short version was used by ice-skaters Torvill and Dean for the dance that made them Olympic champions in 1984.

Elvis Presley – 20th Century

Elvis Aaron Presley (January 8, 1935 – August 16, 1977) was an American singer, musician and actor.

He is one of most influential and most famous musicians of the 20th century, and is widely regarded as a cultural icon.

He made rock and roll music. He also starred in many movies. His fame has lasted for a long time after his death and is currently still one of the most popular men in history.

He is one of the most well-known people from the 20th century in the world. He is so popular that some people know him as only "Elvis". He is also referred to as the "King of Rock and Roll", or simply "The King".



Hound Dog was released in 1952 by Big Mama Thornton. It was number one in the charts for seven weeks. This version had a slower tempo.

It was then released by Elvis in 1957. His version of Hound Dog has a very quick tempo. People often danced rock 'n' roll dances to it.

Guitars, drums and a keyboard is used in the piece. The effect of people clapping is also used.
