Essential knowledge

Key vocabulary

sermon	A talk on a religious topic, given during a church service and based on a passage from the Bible.
sacred	Holy, devoted to a religion, or simply worthy of awe and respect.
denomination	A religious group that has slightly different beliefs from other groups that share the same religion
Catholic	Catholics base their beliefs on the Christian Bible
Methodist	Methodists have personal relationship with God.

Key vocabulary with etymology

sermon – Latin word *sermō* meaning talk

sacred - originates from the Latin word "sacer," meaning , dedicated, or purified" to the gods or anything in their power,

denomination from Latin word *denominatus* means "giving a name" or "naming something".
