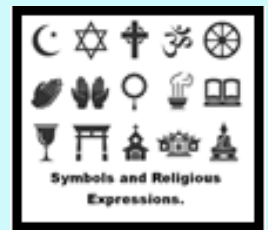

ceremony	A set of actions that someone performs to mark a special occasion.
