Review

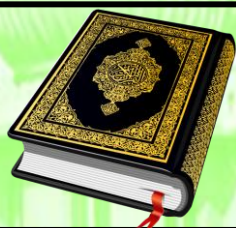
- Muslims are the followers of Islam. Y1

Key vocabulary

Quran	The Islamic sacred book,
Arabic	A language the Quran is written in.
prophet	A person regarded as an inspired teacher by the will of God.
PBUH	Abbreviation for "peace be upon him" which Muslims say after the Prophets' names.
Younus PBUH	Younus PBUH is another prophet in Islam who was swallowed by a whale.
Adam PBUH	First human being on Earth and the first prophet on earth.
Hawa PBUH	The first woman on earth

Key vocabulary with etymology

Prophet - Greek roots, originating with the Greek word *prophētēs* meaning "interpreter" and someone who conveys messages from the divine
