Essential knowledge

- Know the land that was barren and deserted is where the kaba stands and the city of Makkah has been evolving since Zamzam water appeared.
- Know Zamzam water was miraculously generated source of water, which opened up thousands of years ago when the son of Ibrahim, - Ismail was left with his mother Hajar in the desert.
- Know in the present day Muslims perform Hajj—visit the holy Makkah they drink Zamzam and believe it will cure illness and forgive their sins.
