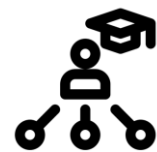

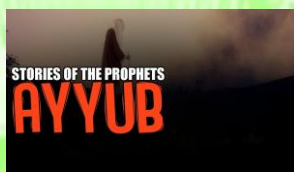
- Know that in life people are rescued from different types of difficulties, for example homelessness, family conflict, loss of personal comfort.

- Know the Quran has verse ' "Indeed, surely, with hardship, comes ease."
- Know the story of Prophet Ayyub and his suffering trials during his lifetime including severe illness, loss of wealth, and loss of children
- Know Muslims turn to prayer when they encounter hardship.

Key vocabulary

Prophet	a person regarded as an inspired teacher or messenger by the will of God.
crisis	A time of intense difficulty
merciful	Bringing some one relief.
Ayyub	Prophet of God
Layya	Wife of Ayyub
sins	An immoral act to be a transgression against divine law.

Key vocabulary with etymology

prophet - originates from the Greek word "prophētēs," meaning "one who speaks for a god" or "spokesman."
