#### Essential knowledge

Investigate ceremonies associated with joining or belonging to a faith community and talk about the meaning of commitment. 2.6b

Engage with variety of people about their beliefs and values and ask questions about the way commitment affects their lives. 2.6c

- Know undertaking Hajj once in a lifetime is a duty for Muslims who are physically and financially able to make the journey to Makkah.
- Know Hajj/pilgrimage shows self-discipline and fulfils a religious duty, bringing Muslims closer to God.
- Know that the Hajj ritual symbolizes belonging to one faith and Muslims walk around Kaaba together to show the oneness and commitment.



#### Thinking like a theologian.

- I will explore the artefacts and clothing Muslims wear when they perform Hajj.
- I will engage in religious talks about Hajj/pilgrimage and ask relevant questions to understand this journey from a Muslims point of view.
- I will reflect on the practice of Hajj, exploring its significance and comparing it to other rituals in my life and those of others.

**Sacrifice** -originates from the Latin word sacrificium, which combines sacer (holy) and facere (to make). **etymologically, sacrifice means "to make holy" or "to make sacred"**.
