**Review**


- Muslims are the followers of Islam. Y1

**Key vocabulary**

<b>Quran</b>	The Islamic sacred book,
<b>Arabic</b>	A language the Quran is written in.
<b>prophet</b>	A person regarded as an inspired teacher by the will of God.
<b>PBUH</b>	Abbreviation for “peace be upon him” which Muslims say after the Prophets’ names.
<b>Younus PBUH</b>	Younus PBUH is another prophet in Islam who was swallowed by a whale.
<b>Adam PBUH</b>	First human being on Earth and the first prophet on earth.
<b>Hawa PBUH</b>	The first woman on earth

**Key vocabulary with etymology**

**Prophet** - Greek roots, originating with the Greek word prophētēs meaning “interpreter” and someone who conveys messages from the divine
