

Key vocabulary

attributes	A quality, character, or characteristic ascribed to someone or something.
sermon	A sermon is a speech, usually given by a priest, as part of a service. Most sermons focus on Bible passages, that contains a moral lesson.
communion	'Togetherness' and this is a ritual to show the togetherness of Christians and God.
Sabbath	The day of the week set aside for worship and rest .
infinite	Being without limits of any kind : endless.
merciful	Someone who is willing to be kind to and forgive people.

Key vocabulary with etymology

sabbath derives from the Hebrew word "shabbat," meaning "to rest" or "to cease"

attribute - verb attribuere, which is made up the prefix ad, meaning "to," and tribuere meaning "give or bestow.
