

Essential knowledge

Raise questions about issues which cause people to wonder and investigate some answers to be found in religious writings and teachings. 2.5a

Key vocabulary

divine	the spiritual or immaterial part of a human being or animal, regarded as immortal.
soul	the non-physical part of a person which is the seat of emotions and character;
immortal	living forever; never dying
spirit	the non-physical part of a person which is the seat of emotions and character;
Atheist	a person who disbelieves or lacks belief in the existence of God or gods
afterlife	life after death.

Key vocabulary with etymology

soul - comes from an ancient Germanic word, *saiwalō*, which likely meant "that which makes something alive."

spirit - comes from the Latin word "spiritus," which originally meant "breath." This Latin word is also the root of the word "inspire" and "expire."
