Why do people have faith?

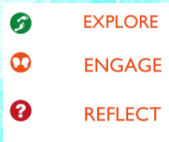


Outcome

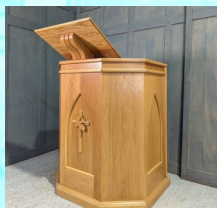

Key Vocabulary

Belief	An acceptance that something exists or is true, especially one without proof.
Symbolism	The idea that things represent other things.

Altar	The altar is the table at the front of the church where the vicar stands and has objects like the bible and candles.
Pulpit	This is a high platform where the vicar stands and speaks to the people in church.
