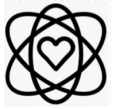


Year 5 - Religious Education – Summer Term

What I will learn?

Explore the origins of sacred writings and consider their importance for believers today. 2.1a

Investigate the life of a person who has been inspired by their faith and make links between belief and actions. 2.2d

- I will look at the Ten Commandments and the laws written in the Torah and look at the importance of those to the believers.
- I will look at the life of famous celebrities who have been inspired by their faith. I will explore lives of sport players and popstars.

What I already know

I should know a range of religious stories and how they help believers to make choices in their lives (Y4) and the core principles of Judaism (Y2).

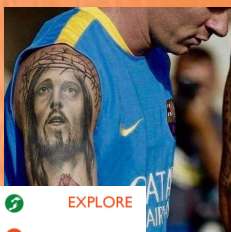
Key Vocabulary

Believer	an adherent of a particular religion; someone with religious faith.
Faith	strong belief in the doctrines of a religion, based on spiritual conviction rather than proof.
Sacred	Something sacred is holy, devoted to a religious ceremony, or simply worthy of awe and respect.
Mitzvot	commandment, ordinance, law, or statute contained in the Torah.
Torah	Torah has 613 Mitzvot. The Golden rule in Torah is to love your neighbour as yourself.

Ten Commandments

- Thou shalt have no other gods before me.
 - Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth.
 - Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.
 - Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.
 - Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee.
 - Thou shalt not kill.
 - Thou shalt not commit adultery.
 - Thou shalt not steal.
 - Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.
 - Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his manservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that is thy neighbour's.

Torah



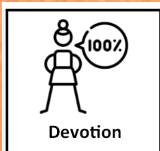

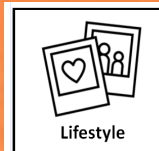
Benteke is a **Christian**. He points up to the sky after scoring goals to thank God, and also prays frequently. He is a footballer.
