Talk about features in stories about Easter that made people feel happy or sad and compare them with my own experiences.

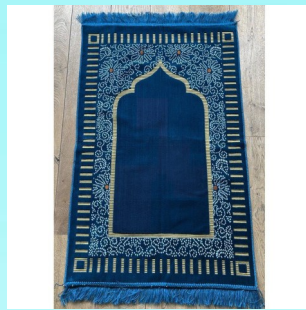
Muslims celebrate Eid

Prayer mat	Muslims pray on a prayer mat.

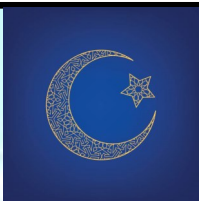

The Crescent Moon and Star is the symbol of Islam



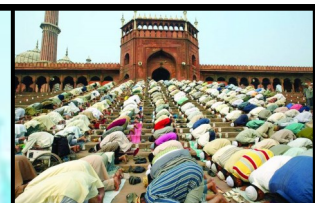
Quran is the holy book of Islam and it has God's teaching and words in it



Wudu wash before praying



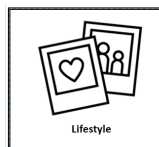
A mosque (A place of worship for Muslims) Muslims bow down to worship
