Please can I ask that holidays are not booked during term time, this is really unsettling for the children and leads to gaps in the children's learning.

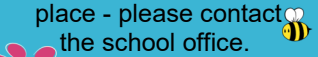

Well Done Y6!

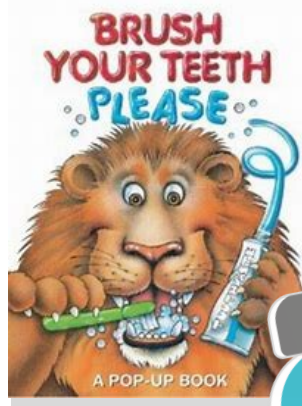
Well done to Y6 this week who represented the school in visiting Chesterton College and had lots of hands on experiences with KS3/4 teachers.

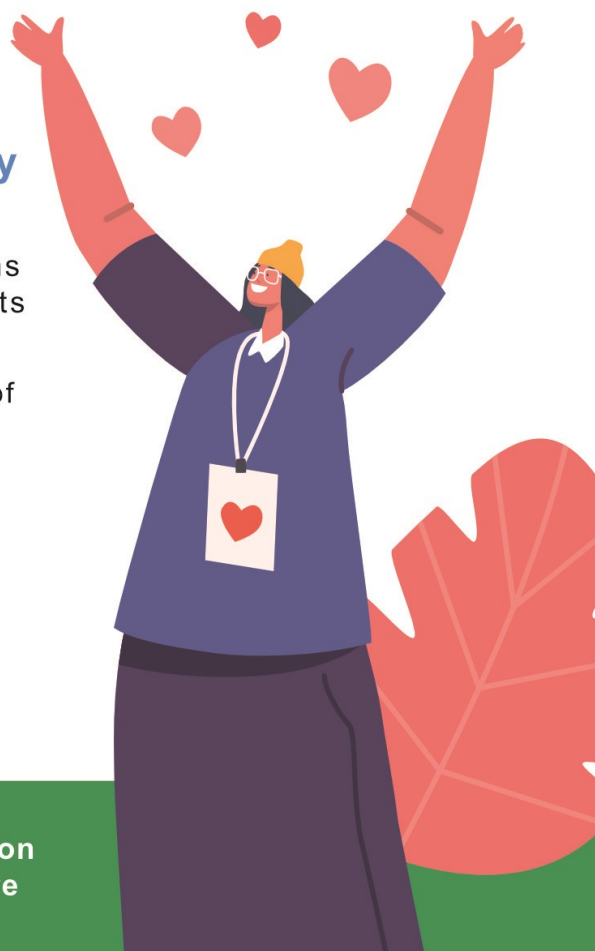
